

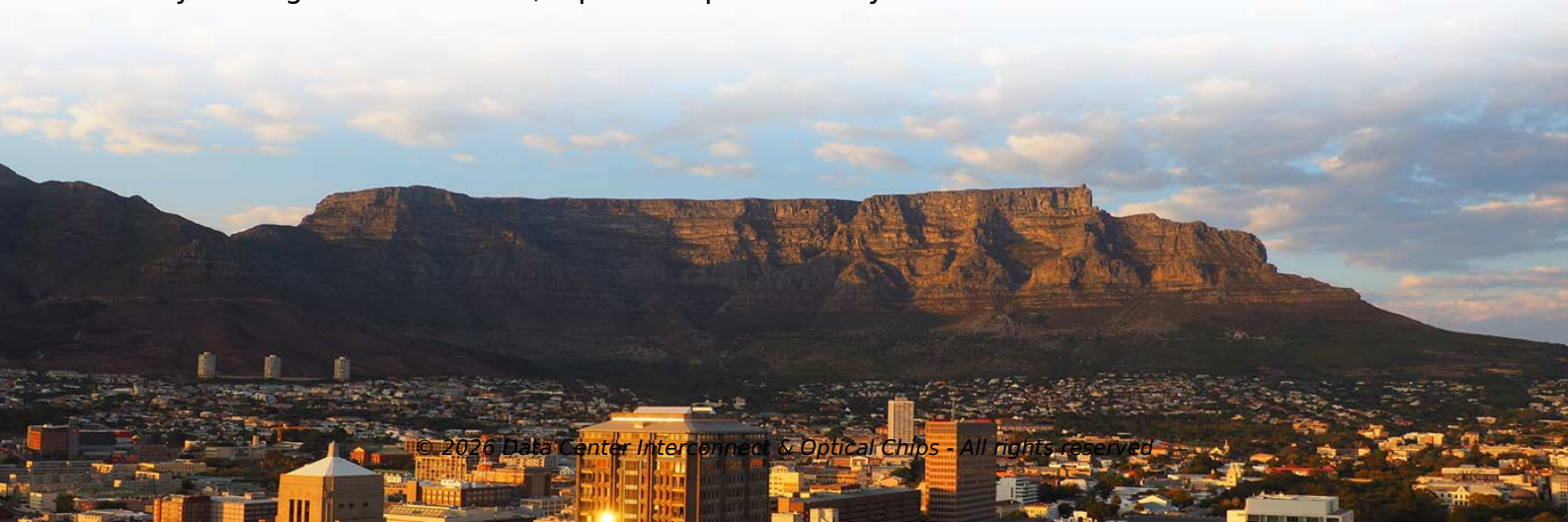
Can one pigtail be split into two



Overview

These two components are closely related—in fact, you can cut a patch cord in half to produce two pigtails—but they serve fundamentally different roles in a network. Understanding the distinction prevents costly spec errors. When wires are pigtailed together like this: one of the black wires carries the current "in" to the nut, and the other two wires carry it "out" to the outlet and whatever other devices are down the line. Splitting power to two switches is a common residential wiring task that uses a single electrical feed to independently control two separate fixtures or devices from a double-gang switch box. This configuration is often used for controlling a ceiling fan and its light, or operating two distinct. Surely I cannot be the only one that will change this setup to a splice with a single pigtail to the new receptacle when changing devices. Does anyone have any insight as to why this is incorrect or why it isn't a problem?

Your question generally creates some. A fiber optic pigtail is a short length of optical fiber cable with a factory-terminated connector on one end and a bare, exposed fiber on the other. Unlike a patch cord—which has connectors on both ends—the bare fiber end of a pigtail is designed to be permanently spliced (either by fusion or.
