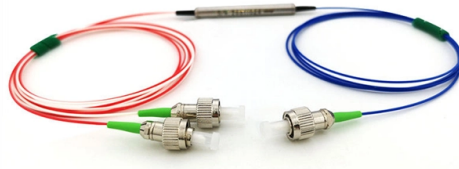


Distribution box hanging on utility pole



Overview

Reclosers are pole mounted recloser units on distribution systems or are installed on distributed energy renewable systems (DERs) at intertie connections, either in an overhead application or a padmounted application. Crossarms: Crossarms are horizontal extensions attached to the power pole. They provide a platform for mounting insulators, transformers, and other equipment. Insulators: A utility pole, commonly referred to as a transmission pole, telephone pole, telecommunication pole, power pole, hydro pole, telegraph pole, or telegraph post, is a column or post used to support overhead power lines and various other public utilities, such as electrical cable, fiber optic cable. These temporary faults can be cleared by a recloser on a pole automatically opening and then reclosing the circuit after the fault. Once the fault has been cleared, the power is restored.
