

High-voltage and low-voltage wires run in the same cable tray



Overview

The mixing of high voltage and low voltage wiring in a single conduit is generally discouraged due to safety considerations and potential interference issues. It usually deals with a voltage of 50 volts or less. The thermistor cables are also always shielded. If the instrument cable is insulated for the maximum voltage level in the conduit (600 V insulation in practice), this is allowed by the NEC for "low voltage" systems, which is anything below. I will be powering a 12V cctv camera. Is it okay to run the cable through a conduit with 220V AC?

Or will it have an interference?

It has been a long time and I don't want to re-read it right now, but article 725 of the NEC code addresses things like this, I believe. I really want to know where the line in the sand is and how things like luminaire dimming MC cable fits into the picture. Unless the answer is UL listed wire can. What are the NEC rules for mixing different voltage cables in the same cable tray?

So practically speaking, if all cables are insulated at 600 V, the NEC allows them to be run in the same conduit or raceway. That doesn't mean it's always a good idea or that it will work

Both those voltages are Low Voltage (50V to 750V). The exact voltages and terminology varies by region, but 120V and 460V are the same class of voltage and so can be in the same conduit.

Can You Run Low Voltage With High Voltage?

Complete separation is typically required, meaning low-voltage cables must not share the same raceway, cable tray, or enclosure as line voltage conductors. However, exceptions exist

Low voltage and normal power in same raceway

In general, the "low voltage" conductors or cables cannot be in the same raceway with power conductors. The dimming conductors in the MC cable comply with 725.136 (I).
