

Lightning protection and grounding requirements for cable trays



Overview

The core requirements for Cable Tray grounding, as per GB 50303-2015, GB 51348-2019, and CECS 31-2023, can be summarized as "metals must be grounded, connections must ensure conductivity, and multiple points must ensure reliability". All bonding jumpers must be sized (as a minimum) to meet the requirements of equipment grounding conductors. Cable trays can be used as the only equipment grounding conductor (EGC), but they must meet certain criteria (only in. Cable tray may be used as the Equipment Grounding Conductor (EGC) in any installation where qualified persons will service the installed cable tray system. Tray fill limits must be calculated properly. Mesh trays reduce installation time while supporting compliance. Understanding NEC Article 392: Cable. us-trations without notice.
