

What bolts are needed for cable trays



Overview

The fittings can be fastened to the cable tray rail either with double clamps of type DOP A2 or with truss-head bolts of type FRS and combination nuts. The exceptions to this are vertical bends, adjustable bend elements and fittings with a side height of 35 mm. These fittings can only maintain spacing or to keep cables in place when the tray is subjected to the minimum bend radius for cables as they exit the bottom of the cable tray. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray is used for instrumentation and control applications that require. Not all cable trays are equivalent. The mechanical and electrical characteristics, tests, certifications, overall quality management, recommendations mentioned in this technical guide only apply to our own cable management ranges and cannot under any circumstances be transposed to the enclosure. The fittings can be used for cable trays of widths of 100 to 600 mm and the heights 35, 60, 85 and 110 mm.
